Though COVID-19 has had an enormous impact on our lives in the last year, United Way of Lapeer County has stayed committed to serving the community. Our dedication to the education, income,



VITA PROGRAM

In April, United Way of Lapeer County kicked off our collaborative with the Volunteer Tax Assistance Program. VITA provides free tax preparation to individuals, enabling Lapeer county residents to avoid the high cost of preparation fees. Despite many challenges--including the pandemic, tax law changes and a filing season that was over a month longer than anticipated-millions of people benefited from the VITA program this year, showing that VITA is more than a program: its a cause. Now, we are already preparing for next year and we want you to get involved! United Way of Lapeer County is looking for FAST TAX site volunteers. In 2020, United Way of Lapeer County brought back \$103,000 to residents of Lapeer County with free in-person and online tax preparation.

In 2021, United Way of Lapeer County assisted with 71 returns representing 89 individuals.

LAPEER HIGH SCHOOL VARSITY LETTER SCHOLARSHIP

For the 2nd year, United Way of Lapeer County has partnered with Lapeer Community Schools to provide a Varsity Letter and scholarship program. In this program, high school students with 90 or more service hours can earn their Varsity Letter for volunteering in their community and high school, and all seniors that apply are entered into a \$1,000 scholarship. United Way of Lapeer County is dedicated to recognizing and rewarding students for their efforts to provide for our community. Applications were due May 21st and have been reviewed and selected.

- Track hours and provide verification information on










GALAXY DIGITAL VOLUNTEER SOFTWARE

NEW LICA FOOD PANTRY!

The Lapeer Interfaith Community Association (LICA) is comprised of five local churches and has been providing food for those in need for more than thrity years. They host a soup kitchen/dinner Monday-Friday through out the year, have three food pantries and a weekly pop up pantry food giveaway. In June, UWLC donated \$5,000 to LICA for them to start building a new LICA soup kitchen/food pantry, which will be located on 1680 N Lapeer Rd.



PARTNER HIGHLIGHT: THE FAMILY LITERACY CENTER

The Family Literacy Center was established in 1980 to help community members reach literacy goals. They help students get their GEDs, which opens doors to education, employment, and self-sufficiency. The Family Literacy Center tutors elementary students who struggle with literacy, and they offer playgroups to prepare children for entering school. In 2021, United Way of Lapeer County granted the Family Literacy Center \$7500 so that they can continue providing their invaluable services to our community. Their efforts to maintain a high regard for education in Lapeer is what we look to support, and in giving to our partners we continue our mission to Live United.
